This year was one of the most challenging and impactful of my eight years at the family center. In just two years, we increased our reach from 3500 to more than 5000+ individuals. In response to the COVID crisis, we worked with partners to provide vaccination and booster clinics, and cash relief grants. We exponentially expanded our afterschool program, from **just under 300 to nearly 800** students. In 2022-23, we'll be celebrating ten years of engaging, supporting and uplifting our community. 2021-22 SERVICES

MEETING URGENT LIVING & HEALTH NEEDS

We provided <u>4200 health supports, including</u> case management & hygiene and PPE, more than 1000 + sets of diapers, and over <u>3100 vaccines</u> and boosters at <u>38 clinics and 26 popups, through</u> our health care partners

Working with our partners, including Alameda County Community Food Bank and the Daily Bowl, we distributed over <u>3 million pounds of groceries</u> to support <u>650 families a month</u>, to help eliminate food insecurity.

Our urgent living supports include safe distribution of food, clothing, & housing referrals. Through funding from First 5 and our collaborative partner, Centro de Servicios, we provided 300+ families with direct relief in the form of gas cards and grocery cards.

STUDENT SUPPORTS

In 2021-22, we exponentially increased our academic and enrichment support.. We reached <u>**790 students**</u> in our afterschool programs, from our pre-pandemic program of **285** students,

We reached out to our community with more than **300 home visits** to eliminate barriers to attending school.

We provided case management and intervention support to <u>170 student</u>s in migrant education and <u>196 unhoused</u> students.

SUSTAINABILITY PLANNING

In 2021, we established a nonprofit corporation, the Union City Family Center Corporation (UCFC-C) to support the operations of UCFC, and received our first donations to this nonprofit. In 2022, we increased our UCFC-C funding by 30%.

REGIONAL LEADERSHIP

We facilitated 4 quarterly collaborative meetings with 40 + agencies represented. As a model agency, we hosted visitors. Our UCFC Coordinator, Jennifer Hawkins was awarded the 2022 Classified Leader of the Year by ACSA Region 6 of California School Administrators (ACSA).



PARTNERS & FUNDERS

The Union City Family Center (UCFC) leverages funding and resources to maximize impact. In 2021-22, our funding came from nonprofit donations (36%), private individual and foundation donations (25%), regional government agencies (23%) & the school district (17%). The Union City Family Center Corporation is the nonprofit fundraising arm of UCFC.
